The Energy Commission of Malaysia (ST) and Korea Gas Safety Corporation Strengthen Ties Through MoU on Gas Safety Cooperation

Putrajaya, 25 April 2025 – The Energy Commission of Malaysia (*Suruhanjaya Tenaga* – ST), today formalized a strategic partnership with the Korea Gas Safety Corporation (KGS) through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), aimed at enhancing gas safety practices and standards in both countries.

The ceremony, held in Chungcheongbuk, South Korea, was officiated by **Ir. Dr. Sanjayan Velautham**, the Chief Operating Officer of the Energy Commission, alongside **Dr. Bahk Gyurng Goog**, the President and CEO of KGS, with representatives from both organizations in attendance.

The MoU signifies a commitment to strengthening energy system resilience and public safety, aligning with Malaysia's **National Energy Transition Roadmap (NETR)**. The key areas of cooperation under the MoU include:

- exchange of technical expertise and best practices;
- joint safety testing and inspections;
- emergency response planning and incident analysis of gas-related incidents; and
- development and application of gas safety benchmarking indices.
