**REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR THE BATTERY ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEM
WITH THE TOTAL CAPACITY OF 400MW/1,600MWh FOR PENINSULAR
MALAYSIA (MyBeST)**

SELECTION OF SHORTLISTED BIDDERS

Putrajaya, 19 December 2025 – The Energy Commission of Malaysia (Suruhanjaya Tenaga - ST) has finalised the shortlisted bidders for the MyBeST competitive bidding programme. The programme has attracted strong industry interest, with proposals received at seven times the total capacity offered.

The MyBeST programme is the country's largest international competitive open bidding programme for grid-scale Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) to date. A total of four (4) grid-connected BESS projects, each with the capacity of 100MW/400MWh, will be commissioned in 2027. These projects will support Malaysia's long-term goals, including reducing reliance on fossil-fuel peaking plants, lowering system costs over time and achieving the National Energy Transition Roadmap (NETR) target of 70% renewable energy capacity by 2050.

Each of the four (4) shortlisted bidders has proposed a different battery technology supplier, providing the opportunity to assess the suitability, actual performance and operational characteristics of a diversity of BESS configurations under Peninsular Malaysia's distinct grid and climatic conditions.
