51 illegal factories still operating despite blitz

A total of 51 factories are still operating illegally despite a by the crackdown Selangor government.

THEY are among 99 illegal factories identified in the state.

State Local Government, Public Transport and New Village Development Committee chairman, Ng Sze Han, told the state assembly yesterday 48 illegal factories had ceased operations.

"The state government needs the cooperation of agencies to stop the 51 illegal factories from operating," he

"The most effective way to stop this illegal operation is by cutting water and electricity supply. The help of the National Water Services Commission and the Energy Commission is needed to eradicate illegal plants."

Ng (DAP-Kinrara) was replying to Tuck Chee Leong Pandamaran) on the status of illegal factories in the state.

He said between July 2018 and February this year, the Department of Environment has handled 127 cases involving illegal factories, including 50 that were brought to court.
