Laundry premises must register with Energy Commission: Ministry

KOTA KINABALU: The Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Ministry (KPDNHEP) advises all laundry premises to register with the Energy Commission as well as install pipeline system that meets the standard approved by the agency and the Fire Department.

KPDNHEP conducted inspections at several self-service laundry premises here, Wednesday, accompanied by six enforcement officers, headed by the State Chief Executive Officer, Taha July.

The operation was also joined by the Energy Commission, Fire and Rescue Department and City Hall Licensing Department.

It was carried out in line with the Ops Ampai implementation as key perform-

ance indicator (KPI) by the Ministry this year.

Ops Ampai was meant to ensure safety complied with the requirements of the Energy Commission and the Fire Department.

It was also to ensure that the use of 50kg LPG (commercial) as fuel for dryer and the information in the Scheduled Goods Control Permit is the same as the findings at the laundry premises, in addition to obtain feedback and views from self-service laundry operators about compliance and the problems they face.

Besides, the physical inspection was also to ensure that the LPG supplier has a CSA licence and that the LPG supply was from a valid source. - **Ottey Peter**
