ST Publishes Malaysia Energy Statistics Handbook 2017

Putrajaya, 23 April – The Energy Commission (ST) recently published the Malaysia Energy Statistics Handbook 2017, a guide that summarises the key energy data and statistics in Malaysia.

The handbook illustrates the energy scenario in Malaysia, from the primary energy supply, to how the energy supply is transformed (energy transformation) from primary to secondary energy, and finally the energy consumption by various end-users. It also includes energy prices and energy indicators, as well as the electricity and piped gas supply performance for year 2016.

This handbook is a supplement to the other publications of ST including the National Energy Balance 2015, Performance and Statistical Information on Electricity Supply Industry in Malaysia 2016 and Piped Gas Distribution Industry Statistics Malaysia 2016.

This handbook is a comprehensive compendium of our national energy data and statistics. It serves as a general reference to policy makers, public and private organisations, students and the public.
